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2025-2026 ACADEMIC YEAR FALL SEMESTER ERASMUS+ STUDENT MOBILITY FOR STUDIES ANNOUNCEMENT

Announcement Date: 09.12.2024

- Erasmus+ student mobility is a program initiated to encourage students to explore different cultures, enhance their language skills, and gain international experience. Within the framework of this program, students have the opportunity to receive education for a specific period at an institution affiliated with their universities, located outside their home countries. Erasmus not only provides students with academic enrichment but also offers a socially and culturally enriching experience, contributing to their personal development. Consequently, students gain the chance to study in a different country, acquire an international perspective, and take steps towards becoming more effective individuals in the globalized world.

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

- Students applying for Erasmus+ student mobility for studies must meet the following conditions during the application process:
 - Being a full-time student enrolled in a program at the associate, undergraduate, master's, or doctoral levels.
 - The current overall GPA for the application must be at least 2.20/4.00 for associate and undergraduate levels and at least 2.50/4.00 for postgraduate levels.
- Double major students are allowed to apply for and participate in the Erasmus+ exchange program for only one of their majors during a single application period.
- Research assistants must obtain written approval from the relevant department manager during the application process.
- Students enrolled in English and Turkish language preparatory programs, as well as scientific preparatory programs, are **not eligible** to apply for Erasmus+ exchange programs.
- Students on registration freeze **cannot** undertake study mobility during the frozen registration period. However, they are allowed to apply for mobility during the registration freeze.
- For master's and doctorate students with thesis who have not completed their credit or non-credit course load in graduate programs to benefit from Erasmus + exchange programs, the student's thesis advisor and the head of the relevant department, and the decision of the Graduate School board of directors are required.
- If the courses to be taken within the scope of Erasmus+ student mobility for studies are taught in a language other than English, the student **must be able to speak and certificate** the relevant language at the minimum level determined by the accepting institution.



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- Within the same educational level (bachelor's, master's, doctoral), if applicable, the total duration of Erasmus Mundus scholarship or the student mobility period conducted in the 2014-2020 Erasmus+ period and the new Erasmus+ period (2021-2027) cannot exceed 12 months. Even if no grant is provided, the total duration of student mobility activities (study/internship) within the same educational level cannot exceed 12 months. For programs that combine two levels (such as integrated doctorate) or in higher education programs where two levels are completed within a single level (such as medical education), the total duration is a maximum of 24 months.
- Doctoral programs cannot benefit from Erasmus+ exchange programs at the following stages:
 - In the last semester before the doctoral qualification exam for students who have not taken the doctoral qualification exam.
 - In the last semester before the defense of the thesis proposal.
 - In the last semester of the program's maximum duration.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

- Carefully read the **announcement** and the **Erasmus+ Exchange Programs Directive** before applying.
- All documents to be uploaded to the application system must be in **PDF** format.
- The transcript to be uploaded to the application system must be a verifiable, QR-coded transcript obtained within the application period. Newly enrolled students in master's and doctoral programs who have not yet established a GPA must upload their latest transcripts showing the 2024-2025 fall semester registrations (even if it does not include a GPA) and transcripts from the last program/department they graduated from.
- The mobility activities within the scope of this announcement are limited to the duration of the project 2024-1-TR01-KA131-HED-000202221, and the student mobility covers the **academic year of 2025-2026 fall semester**.
- It is **crucial** to check the final nominee date, application deadline, available courses and their contents, as well as the required documents (language certificate, etc.) for the university you prefer or have been placed in. Additionally, universities may make changes to application conditions and acceptance requirements. Therefore, it is the responsibility of the candidates to stay informed about the application conditions of their preferred university. It is **essential** to thoroughly review the institution's website that you plan to apply to.
- Being placed at one of the preferred universities **does not guarantee** receiving an acceptance letter from the host university and does not imply that the host institution will accept you. The host institution reserves the right to reject the mobility.
- The right to participate in Erasmus+ student mobility for one academic year **cannot be transferred** to another academic year.



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ERASMUS+ PARTNER UNIVERSITIES

- Students can only choose institutions with which their department/program has a partnership and carry out mobility in these institutions. 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EVALUATION CRITERIA

Academic performance level (converted from the YOK 4-point grading scale to the 100-point grading scale)	%50 (out of a total of 100 points)
Language proficiency (students scoring B1 or higher in the language test will be considered)	%50 (out of a total of 100 points)
Children of martyrs and veterans	+15 points*

Students who have been granted protection, care, or accommodation decisions within the scope of Law No. 2828 on Social Services and Law No. 5395 on the Protection of Children	+10 points***

For students selected for mobility: Failure to attend meetings/training organized by the higher education institution regarding mobility without a valid excuse (applies if the student reapplies for Erasmus).	-5 points
Declaring intent to take the language exam but failing to participate without a valid excuse (applies if the student reapplies for Erasmus).	-5 points

* Priority is given to the spouses and children of combat veterans, as well as the spouses and children of martyrs, along with individuals covered by Article 21 of the Anti-Terror Law No. 3713 dated 12/4/1991, who were injured, disabled, or died as a result of terrorist acts while performing their duties domestically or abroad as public servants or after the removal of their status, and the spouses and children of those who lost their lives or were killed. Additionally, priority is given to the spouses and children of civilians who became disabled or lost their lives due to the coup attempt and terrorist acts that took place on July 15, 2016, and the continuation of these acts, as per Article 7 of Decree Law No. 667 dated July 23, 2016, for applications to the Erasmus+ student mobility program.

**For prioritization, the student must present the Disability Health Board report specified in the "Regulation on Disability Assessment for Adults," published in the Official Gazette dated February 20, 2019, and numbered 30692.

***For prioritization, the student must present a letter from the Ministry of Family and Social Policies indicating that they have a protection, care, or accommodation decision according to Law No. 2828.



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GRANT AMOUNTS

- Students benefiting from educational mobility will be provided grant support for a maximum of 5 months.
- Students who wish to do so may waive financial support.
- The total quota number is 6.
- The table below shows the individual support grant amounts to be applied when sending students to countries associated with the program:

ADDITIONAL GRANT SUPPORT

- Additional Grant Support will be provided to participants with limited means in addition to the grant they deserve. To be eligible for this grant, participants with limited means are defined as individuals who are economically and socially disadvantaged and fall into the following subcategories:
 - Those covered by Law No. 2828 (those who have protection, care, or accommodation decisions according to Law No. 2828, as determined by the Ministry of Family and Social Services)
 - Students for whom protection, care, or accommodation decisions have been made under the Child Protection Law No. 5395
 - Those receiving orphan's/death pension without other parental income
 - Children of martyrs/veterans
 - Individuals receiving livelihood allowance for themselves or their families (a document proving that the student, his/her parents, or guardian received financial support from municipalities, public institutions, and organizations (Ministries, Social Assistance and Solidarity Foundations, Foundations General Directorate, KIZILAY, AFAD, etc.) at the time of applying for Erasmus is sufficient.)
 - Individuals with disabilities*
 - Students receiving disability or livelihood allowance under Law No. 2022 dated 01.07.1976 regarding the Granting of Monthly Payments to Disabled and Needy Turkish Citizens Aged 65 and Older, as well as Disabled and Needy Turkish Citizens**
 - Those who themselves or their first-degree relatives have received disaster aid from AFAD.



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*Individuals with a documented disability rate of at least 50%, as evidenced by the Disability Health Board report specified in the "Regulation on Disability Assessment for Adults," published in the Official Gazette dated February 20, 2019, and numbered 30692.

Note: Scholarships from the Kredi ve Yurtlar Kurumu (KYK) and similar scholarships, other grants, aids, and scholarships of a similar nature, one-time assistance are not considered within the scope of this financial support.

Upon request and upon documenting their situations, additional grant support is provided to students who fall within the above-mentioned scope, depending on the type of mobility, in the following amounts:

Type of Mobility	Additional Grant Support
Student mobility between 2 and 12 months.	250 € Monthly

GREEN TRAVEL SUPPORT

- Students/graduates may receive a one-time additional grant of 50 Euros if they choose eco-friendly travel.

TRAVEL SUPPORT CALCULATIONS

- In order to contribute to the travel expenses of the students, the distance between the starting point of the mobility and the place where the activity takes place is determined and paid through the distance calculator provided by the European Commission. The grant equivalent of the kilometers calculated in the distance band calculator in the table below is the round-trip figure, which is not multiplied by two.

- As a general principle, for distances under 500 km, participants are expected to travel by low emission means of transport. Green travel is the use of public transport with low carbon emissions. The use of buses, trains and shared cars are included in the scope of green travel. In order to receive green travel support, green travel must be used on the way there and back and more than half of the entire trip must be made using green vehicles.
- If necessary, individual support grants can be awarded for travel time before and after the activity, with a maximum of two days for travel days and a maximum of six days in case of green travel.



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INCLUSION SUPPORT

- The Erasmus+ Program encourages the participation of individuals with special needs. A person with special needs is a potential participant whose personal physical, mental, or health condition, if not for additional financial support, would prevent their participation in the project/mobility activity. To request additional grants for students requiring inclusion support, the University needs to apply to the National Agency.
